Join Us For The Weekend

Each year towards the end of July, COPS holds its Annual Survivors' Weekend and Service of Remembrance.

The weekend brings together families from all over the UK to gain **peer support and comfort from the only people who can truly say, "I understand"**.

This year's event begins on **Friday 29 July** and is being held at the **Drayton Manor Conference Suite at Drayton Manor in Staffordshire**.

The Annual Survivor weekend allows Survivors to meet other Survivors, share experiences and learn how others have rebuilt their lives.

This year there will be information stalls, as well as workshops and activities, such as wakeboarding for older children and Thomas the Tank Engine Land for the younger ones.

The weekend also includes a sit down three course meal on the Saturday evening, which is

attended by Survivors, police officers and other members of the wider police family.

Care of Police Survivors will also be hosting its **Annual Meeting on Saturday 30 July** from 2pm to 3pm. The weekend culminates in the **Annual Service of Remembrance at 11am on Sunday 31 July** at the National Memorial Arboretum.

Join us on the Unity Tour



The UK Police Unity Tour is looking for a final few members of the Police Family to **join its London chapter** for the annual bike ride in aid of Care of Police Survivors.

This year the tour has rides starting in **Norfolk, Leicestershire, Scotland and Wales**, all concluding at the COPS Service of Remembrance at the National Arboretum in Staffordshire on 31 July.

There are some places left

on the London ride – beginning on 29 July – which organisers would like to fill.

Ch Supt Rob Atkin, who organises the Police Unity Tour, said: **"The tour provides a unique opportunity for officers and Survivors to ride side by side** in memory of their family members and colleagues.

Each cyclist rides in memory of a police officer who has died on duty – wearing a wrist band. This is then

passed on to a surviving family member at the conclusion of the COPS Service of Remembrance.

Each person taking part in the tour undertakes to raise £400 for the charity – with a £125 registration fee that covers all hotels, ride shirts and food en route.

Positive News At Difficult Time Of Year

Until 12 years ago **Spring was, for me, one of the best seasons of the year** – partly because it signals the end of winter and, hopefully, the worst of the weather. But also because it brings new life to both flora and fauna and generally refreshes the countryside.

Back in 2004, however, all that changed when my elder son Richard was killed while on duty with Surrey Police.

Since then, **14 March has always been a sad and difficult day for me**, as all Survivors will understand from their own experience.

This year, however, the day was brightened with two pieces of good news.

The first news was a personal matter. I learned that **police dog Gunny, named in memory of my son** was, that very day, being licensed to work as a police dog with Surrey Police. My concerns that he might fail during his training and not make the grade were all unfounded.

The following day my wife Carol and I, along with Richard's fiancée Laura, were invited to watch Gunny and his sister Gia perform their passing out display. Both performed exceptionally well and **I am just so proud to know that "Gunny" is now working with the force again**.

May I take this opportunity publicly to thank Surrey Police for honouring my son in this way for it means so much to me.

It was also the evening of 14 March that the board of the Police Arboretum Memorial Trust (PAMT) met to finalise whether or not names should be permanently displayed on the new police memorial to be built at the National Memorial Arboretum.

I am not ashamed to say that on such an emotional day for me **the announcement that names would indeed appear on the memorial**



overwhelmed me with joy (see below).

On behalf of COPS I want to place on record our sincere thanks for that decision.

I understand, however, that a decision is still to be made regarding exactly which names should appear on the memorial. A committee, which will include some Survivors, will be established to consider this.

COPS' view is that the names of ALL officers who died on duty should be displayed

regardless of the circumstances of their deaths.

Failure to include all names will certainly cause a lot of distress to Survivors so, as I stated in my open letter to the trustees of the PAMT on www.copsnews.co.uk: "Please don't hurt the families yet again."

In a statement, the UK Police Memorial said: "We are pleased to confirm, by unanimous agreement, the decision that permanent names will be included on the new UK Police Memorial.

"A sub-committee to advise on the full naming policy will be convened...to listen to all the views of those with an interest in the Memorial. Survivors will be fully included in this process."
